Hello Friends! 2024 is an exciting year for Family Promise of Cowlitz County. I have stepped into my new role as Executive Director, welcomed with open arms. I want to thank the community for all the love and support during our transition. I have a strong passion to end family homelessness, and a love for this community. Partnerships are the key to a successful organization.

I served as the Case Manager from

August 2020. Since coming to FPCC we have supported over 35 families and 124 children with

shelter, through to graduation into permanent housing. I am so proud of our accomplishments as a community, after all, it takes a village. In 2021 we began to work on a prevention program, with the assistance of HUMI (Help Us Move In) we were able to form Promise of home, our prevention program to stabilize families at risk. We have served over 140 families and 274 children, preventing them from becoming or remaining homeless. The shelter program has been successful, and we have hired a new staff member, Jenny Kendall. She has been an asset to our team and has a passion for our mission.

Welcome Jenny! Jamie Craig continues to be the heart of our program, and is now the Office Manager, officially. We would like to thank Jamie for her years of dedication and loyalty. Thank you, Jamie.

The past year has definitely been challenging. 2024 is our year to rebuild, restore and re-invent. Like we teach our families: self-sufficiency, resilience, and perseverance! Please help us spread the word as


